The Polishing Process

Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: but rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy. 1 Peter 4:12, 13.

Not without a purpose does God send trial to His children. He never leads them otherwise than they would choose to be led if they could see the end from the beginning, and discern the glory of the purpose which they are fulfilling as workers together with Him. He subjects them to discipline to humble them, to lead them, through trial and affliction, to see their weakness and draw near to Him....

They may CHOOSE to be polished or to remain unpolished. But everyone who is pronounced worthy of a place in the Lord's temple must submit to the polishing process. Without the polishing that the Lord gives, they can reflect no more light than a common pebble. Christ says to man, You are mine. I have bought you. You are now only a rough stone; but if you will place yourself in My hands, I will polish you, and the luster with which you shall shine will bring honor to My name. No man shall pluck you out of My hand. I will make you My peculiar treasure. On My coronation day, you will be a jewel in My crown of rejoicing.



The Divine Worker spends little time on worthless material. Only the precious jewels does He polish after the similitude of a palace, cutting away all rough edges. This process is severe and trying; it hurts human pride. Christ cuts deep into the experience that man in his self-sufficiency has regarded as complete and takes away self-uplifting from the character. He cuts away the surplus surface, and putting the stone to the polishing wheel, presses it close, that all roughness may be worn away. Then, holding the jewel up to the light, the Master sees in it a reflection of Himself, and He pronounces it worthy of a place in His casket. Blessed be the experience, however severe, that gives new value to the stone. Heavenly Places P267.

But why a horse? In fact, why a team of horses? The simple answer we should all be able to give to any question regarding any of our actions is simply, God told me so. Truthfully, I was a little surprised at the Lord's leading but I was OK with it. My journey has repeatedly told me, trust and obey, for there's no other way.

However, I do sympathize with those looking on who may not be so convinced. After all, how could a horse possibly fit into ministry? If you've had a moment to consider the information on our website and previous newsletters, you will know that a key component of the horse team is to pull a wagon displaying an 8 foot Daniel 2 statue. Yes - it will turn heads and that's the point. Quite simply, something wholesome drawing attention to the Lords imminent return to the many who will see it.

But the other week, as I was considering the authenticity of the Lords request (it's called doubting), He brought me a message from heaven that put me in my rightful place (which is being totally surrendered to what ever He asks irrespective of how it may appear). This is despite the numerous miracles the Lord used to bring these horses to us.

I was about to cross the road in our local neighborhood. I turned to check for oncoming traffic when I noticed a familiar sight. Approaching was an old vintage car. The driver was an older gentleman who lives just around the corner - a lovely man who is often up for a chat. He slowed and pulled up next to me. We greeted and exchanged the usual for this time of year. I casually asked how is Christmas was. He paused, slowly muffled the word lonely, but quickly moved on to other conversation. I instantly felt sick. I wasn't sure if it was because I asked a question I shouldn't have or whether it was because of the answer he gave. Rightly or wrongly I chose not to dwell on it. I too moved the conversation on.

He began sharing with me the story behind the old car he was driving. Yes, he had shared the story before, but I was more than happy to hear it again. At an appropriate time I suggested that maybe one day soon I could give him a race in his old car! I'm sure at first he didn't know quite what to make of my request. Quickly I clarified my statement. I would drive our team of horses and he could drive his old car. He laughed. It was a great opportunity to share the soon arrival of our Clydesdale horse team and the purpose behind having them. Interestingly, as I gave him the detail his face lit up.



You see, this is what I didn't know. He is a Vietnam war veteran who has had and still does suffer from PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). A number of years ago he begrudgingly moved to this neighborhood. It was his wife who wanted to move - he was happy to stay put. However due to her request, he sold the house they were living in and built her this new house. Tragically soon after they moved, she left him for another relationship. This had only compounded an earlier tragedy that had prevented him from having his own children. The use of agent orange in the war had rendered him sterile. Can you imagine - what a desperately sad situation!

Now I understood why his Christmas had been lonely. How my heart ached for him. All by himself in a place he would rather not be. What a sin sick world we live in.

As I finished sharing about our horse team, he volunteered the reason for his excitement. He said to me, "I love animals. . . and I especially love Clydesdales. They played a significant role in my healing during the dark times of coping with my PTSD. I can't wait until you get them."

I knew the Lord was speaking to me through this man.

Dear reader, I can promise you this. As soon as our horse team arrives, I will be leading them up the street to visit and spend time with this dear man. The least I can do is to use these magnificent creatures to bring joy into the life of this lonely man.

For those of us who doubt, the message is clear. The Lord says, these animals are mine. They will declare My soon return and bring joy and hope to the lonely. Sounds familiar doesn't it.

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised. To preach the acceptable year of the Lord. (Luke 4:18,19)

This is the job Jesus has now given us. We need to use all of the resources He makes available to us.

So, with all of that said is the horse worth it? Maybe the better question is, is this man's life worth it
